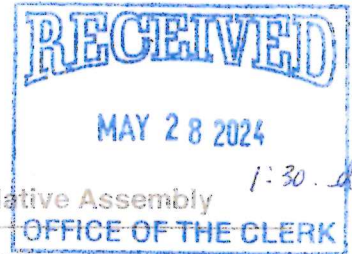

Dear Mr. Speaker,

I am writing to you regarding the allegations you recently brought forward concerning the former Government House Leader, Mr. Jeremy Harrison. In your remarks, you made serious allegations regarding bullying, harassment, long guns, and handguns in the Legislative Building.

The presence of a firearm in the Legislative Assembly raises significant concerns for the safety and security of all members, staff, and visitors. The possibility that a high-ranking member of the government caucus risked their safety and the integrity of the functioning of the Legislative Assembly is completely inappropriate and extremely alarming.

Given the severity of these allegations, I ask you to urgently convene the House Services Committee to discuss the allegations and appoint an independent investigator. It would also be up to the Committee to establish the terms of reference for the investigation.

While I recognise the sensitivity of the request for you and your office, the integrity of democratic institutions in our province comes first. The rule of law must be upheld and the basic principles of workplace safety and accountability must be respected.

I trust that you will handle this matter with the seriousness and care it deserves, and that you will take the necessary steps to address people's concerns.
